### Dale Warland Singers Commission Grant

This grant provides \$10,000 to support artistically meaningful and mutually beneficial collaborations with a composer of a new work.

- \$7,500 of the grant award is designated for the composer fee
- \$2,500 may support other project expenses

#### **Core Values**

- Artistry in performance and composition
- Supporting choruses and their missions
- Supporting composers and new work

#### **Project Period**

May be up to 2 years – The new work must be premiered by the chorus within this period.



## Dale Warland Singers Commission Grant Eligibility

In the 2026 grants cycle, we will be accepting applications from **Professional** Choruses and **Professional-Core Choirs**.

Defined as fully professional choruses that pay 100% of their singers and choruses with a core of professional singers (25% of singers, or 12 singers, whichever is fewer)



## Dale Warland Singers Commission Grant Other Eligibility Considerations

- Must be fiscally sponsored, a registered Canadian charity, or have 501(c)3 designation in US
- Applicant chorus must have an active Chorus America membership
- Cannot be a recent recipient (2016-present)
- Please review ineligible expenses to ensure eligibility

4 Narrative Questions

- Starts with an Eligibility Quiz must pass this to continue to application
- Contact information
- Mission statement





- About the Composer
- About the Commission Artistic Mission & Vision
- About the Commission Community Impact
- No word or character limits, recommend 2-4 paragraphs for each question.
- Cut and pasting from other applications is encouraged





## Dale Warland Singers Commission Grant Application Requirements



**Assurances Checklist** 

#### **Attachments**

- Documentation of registered Canadian charity or US IRS 501c3 letter
  - For applicant or fiscal sponsor
- Fiscally Sponsored Projects Only Documentation of your fiscal sponsorship agreement
- Project Budget, a template is available as convenience
- Letter of Commitment from the Composer



#### **Assurance Checklist**

- Checklist in lieu of a long list of attachments (board list, Form 990, etc.)
- Questions related to governance, finances, and internal processes.
- Check and/or provide clarifying information as needed



## Dale Warland Singers Commission Grant Application Requirements



**Work Samples** 

#### Required

- 1 representative score from the composer
- 1 representative recording/video of chorus
- Track listing (template available)

#### Optional

- An optional additional score
- An optional additional recording/video of chorus

### **Application Review How Decisions Are Made**

- Please heavily reference the Scoring Rubric to gain an understanding of what the panel is looking for in each application.
- Note the increased weighting of Work Samples
- Scoring Rubric directly ties back to the commission narrative questions, project budget, and work samples submitted.



# **Application Review**Who Will Review Applications?

- Then a panel of up to 5 individuals from across the US & Canada score your application (referencing the scoring rubric).
- All panelists must disclose conflicts of interest, sign a confidentiality agreement, and participate in a training on implicit bias.



## **Application Review**Who Can Serve as a Panelist?

- Chorus America is assembling a group of up to 5 panelists for this year's commission grant opportunity.
- All panelists bring an understanding of commissioning and composing and understanding of nonprofit arts management and funding.
- A preference will be given for individuals who have a demonstrated commitment to the principles of access, diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- Panelist demographic information to be shared and published on our website.
